Words cannot express my gratitude to God for the great things that have taken place in the 2014 - 2015 Conference Year. God has showered his blessings upon us in immeasurable ways around The Cathedral @ St. Paul African Methodist Episcopal Church.

Our theme for this Conference year was "So we built the wall...for the People had a mind to work" Building for the Future Today " Nehemiah 4:6

Our overall goal was to rebuild the spiritual cavity of the people of God through Worship, Study and Prayer. We had dynamic

preaching throughout the conference year that shared the Word of God. We established three additional ministries; The Senior Adult Ministry (SAMS), The Women Armed for Christian Services (WACS), and the Rehoboth New Life Team (AA NA). As a result of our weekly Spirit filled worship celebrations, radio ministry, Bible Classes, Social Action, and Prayer Line, over 50 souls were added to the Kingdom of God with an average weekly attendance of 175 parishioners.

After much discussion and strategies for stewardship accountability, we are renovating the Mother Church of the 5th Episcopal District, the oldest AME Church established west of the Mississippi River, beginning in November. Our partnership with Cass Bank will allow us to renovate our Sanctuary with new flooring, carpet, fresh Paint, and new pew pads. We also will renovate the Fellowship Hall, install new windows, tuck point where needed, and pressure wash the exterior of the building. We are updating the electrical system which will allow us to upgrade our technology with hi-tech computers and HD monitors for worship. We are investing an approximately \$150,000.00 or more in our place of worship. Our renovations are expected to be completed by Easter 2016. To God Be the Glory!

Rodney Francis and his Male Chorus from Washington Tabernacle Baptist Church. June 28th Women's Day celebration, Keynote Speaker: Lady Gail Booker, First Lady of St. Paul. Come to Jesus Weekend June 5-7 featured our annual Tent Revival. St. Paul hosted the Missouri Conference Lay Organization weekend Workshop and Worship Service June 13-14Special Guest Bishop Clement W. Fugh, Presiding prelate, 14th Episcopal District. The New Members/Discipleship classes convened from April through September 2015, twenty-five persons attended the classes. In August at the 4th Quarterly Conference we were blessed to have two ministers to join the ministerial staff, Rev. Dr. Ralph Crabbe and Rev. Hugh Smith. Social Action Commission Report

October 9, 2015

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. said, "Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about things that matter". For too long we at St. Paul have been silent about "things" happening in & around our church. It was not until the Right Reverend T. Larry Kirkland, Bishop of the 5th Episcopal District appointed Reverend Spencer Lamar Booker to St. Paul at the 159th Missouri Annual Conference that we found our voice again.

In January, 2014, the new pastor, appointed one of his stewards, Karen Parker Davis to champion the Social Action Commission. This chairperson named six church members to serve on this committee. After we organized, appointed officers & determined roles & goals, we searched community organizations to see where we fit within the community structure. While we were strategizing, Michael Brown was killed and his murder catapulted us into the "Black Lives Matter" movement. We marched in the streets of Ferguson & in our church community led by Pastor & First Lady Booker.

This social justice movement ignited the commission & church to accomplish the following:

- We worked with church member Rev. Ella M. Jones to be the first African American female to win a seat on Ferguson's city council
- We held our annual ecumenical service with Manchester United Methodist Church at St. Paul and together we cleaned a vacant lot behind St. Paul for a "Day On"
- We advocated on behalf of a former church member who was on death row for a stay of execution, by holding a press conference, signing a petition & phoning Governor Jay Nixon to encourage the stay of execution
- We had a local attorney discuss the importance of knowing our rights as a juror & accepting & not "getting out of" juror duty
- We had a dialogue with our neighborhood police captain on ways to better communicate with the police during altercations & foster improved interactions
- We joined the Pulpit to Porches Program with Better Family Life (BFL) & committed to canvas the neighborhood for a full year. This effort is threefold; to get to know our neighbors, inform them of services offered at BFL, & for St. Paul to meet the needs of all people through Jesus Christ our Lord
- We hosted a neighborhood resource fair by opening our doors to the community; we interacted with 75 neighborhoods & 10 social service vendors
- We participated in a Peace March & Rally at the Demetrius Johnson Foundation, part II will take place this fall at the O'Fallon Park & Recreation Complex

There are yet many things we want to pursue and the work is listed below.

- 1. Collaborate with local & other AME churches ongoing
- 2. Host quarterly town hall meetings October & ongoing
- 3. Sponsor NAACP & voter registration drives ongoing
- 4. Partner with Manchester United Methodist Church for diversity awareness programs November
- 5. Work with committeemen, state & US representatives for community development initiatives-November
- 6. Investigate potential grants to support initiatives ongoing
- 7. Invite attorney to provide Part II of jury workshop ASAP
- 8. Sustain canvassing effort within the neighborhood ongoing through June
